Narrative Report

Introduction

I am currently employed full time by Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary and on the faculty of Harvard Medical School, providing inpatient consultation services and Emergency Department Attending roles. After completing my training in Ophthalmology in 1984 at University of Pennsylvania Scheie Eye Institute, I joined the faculty as Clinical Assistant Professor, where I divided my time between resident education and clinical practice in the Scheie Eye Associates group.

Area of Excellence

My focus at Scheie Eye Institute was Comprehensive Ophthalmology until, in 1991, I completed a glaucoma fellowship at Hahnemann University Hospital, (now known as Drexel University). I saw glaucoma and cataract patients in a clinical practice at the Nemours Health Clinic, a nonprofit entity established in Wilmington, DE for elderly, indigent qualified Delaware residents. The staff of optometrists referred their glaucoma patients to me for diagnosis, management, and surgery. In addition, I served as Chairman of the Department of Ophthalmology at ChristianaCare Hospital, and I organized consistent attending coverage for subspecialty clinics, Emergency Department and inpatient consultation for ChristianaCare Hospital.

In 2004 I relocated to Cape Cod where I joined a group practice, dividing my time equally between comprehensive ophthalmology and glaucoma. I received ophthalmology referrals from local physicians including primary care, endocrinology, infectious disease, and retina, as well as Falmouth Hospital Emergency Department. I provided inpatient consultation at Falmouth Hospital and responded to the Emergency Department as well as multiple local Urgent Care Clinics until February 2017 when I accepted a position at MEE as Hospitalist.

Teaching

While at Scheie Eye Institute, I lectured on a variety of topics to residents and medical staff, participated in Grand Rounds presentations, staffed the resident clinic, and supervised resident surgery, predominantly cataract surgery. At Nemours Health Clinic, I provided clinical training to optometrists who were applying for therapeutic licensure. As Chief of the Ophthalmology Clinic at ChristianaCare Hospital, I supervised the Temple University Ophthalmology residents. Both in clinic and in surgery, I mentored the trainees during their rotation at ChristianaCare Hospital. As a community-based physician, I participated in the Tufts University School of Medicine program, mentoring medical students during their surgical subspecialty rotation. I have provided educational programs to the medical staff and lay community, both clinically and in conjunction with the Falmouth Hospital Ethics Committee, which I chaired for the past 10 years. In that role we presented several symposia to the medical and support staff on a variety of topics in medical ethics.

Currently, I provide clinical services to the MEE Emergency Department and inpatient consultations as well as resident training Massachusetts Eye & Ear, Massachusetts General Hospital, and Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Summary

My goal is to provide exceptional clinical care and play a pivotal role in supporting today's medical community and teaching tomorrow's leaders. I look forward to contributing to and developing programs to optimize resident training and satisfaction. Clinically, I hope to identify and optimize patient satisfaction, safety and outcomes through collaboration on clinical protocols for which Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts Eye and Ear are lauded worldwide.
